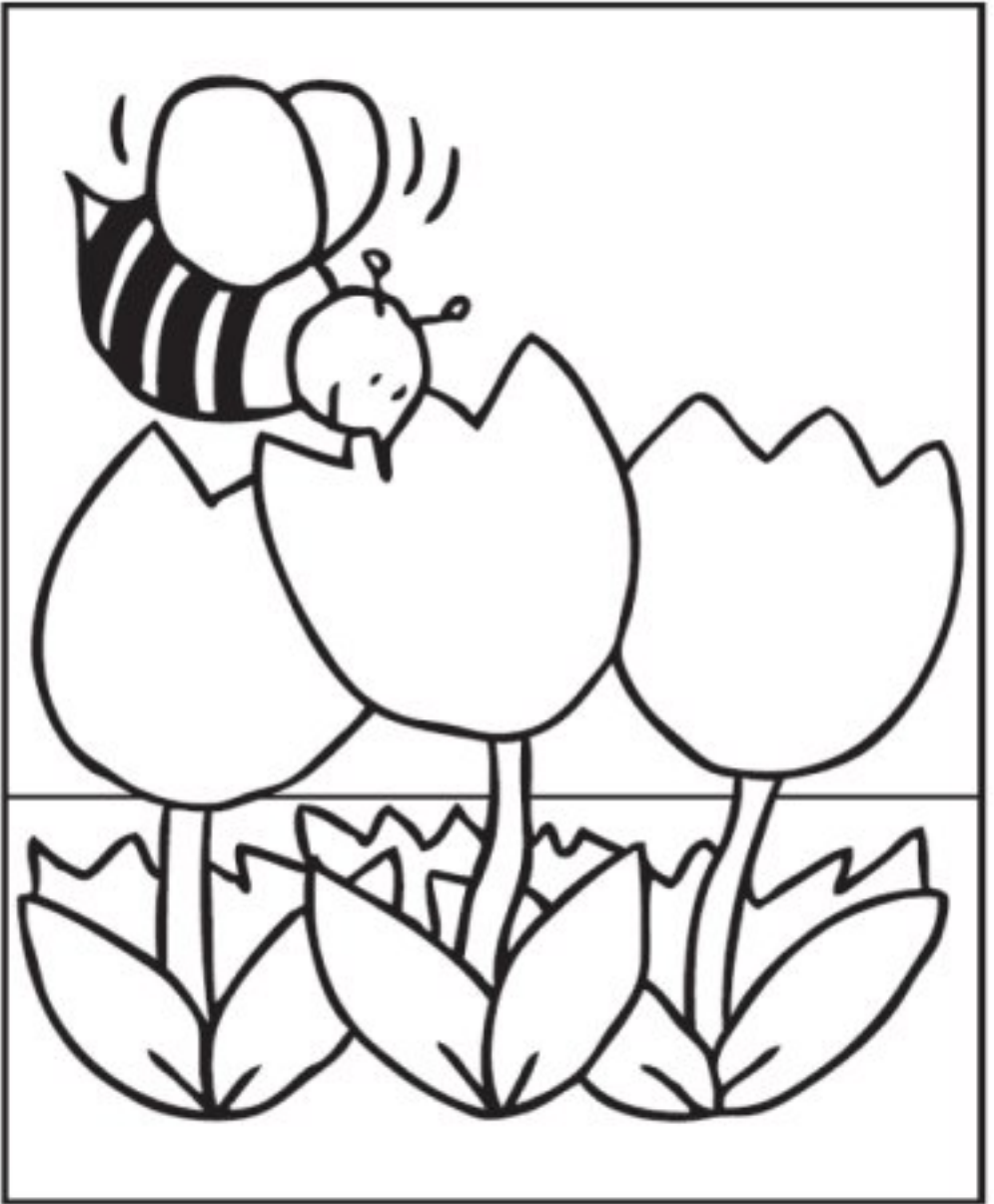

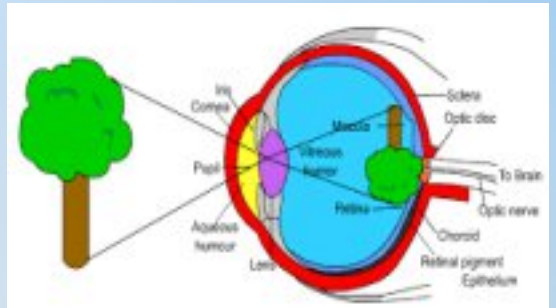


Facts about your amazing eyes!

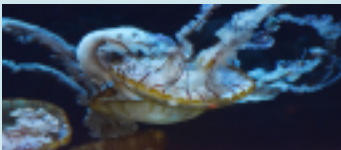
CAN YOU GUESS?



Which animal has the most eyes? I thought it would be a spider (they have 8) but it's even more surprising. It's a scallop! They have eyes all around their mantle (the edge bit) - 200 of them!



Scallops are unusual because unlike most similar animals they can swim and move around. They don't have a brain, though some scientists think they have really good vision.



Another animal you wouldn't think had eyes is the jellyfish. In fact they have 24!



Box jellyfish are one of the most dangerous jellyfish in the world and have 200 eyes; they can see quite well. They have different parts of their eyes for looking up and down and their good vision may mean they can hunt for prey rather than just waiting for it to bump into them.

The biggest eyes belong to the colossal squid. They are as big as a dinner plate! That's because they live in the deep ocean where there's hardly any light! Having very big eyes helps them see even when it's so dark.





Reindeer also have very interesting eyes. In summer they are yellow but in winter they change to blue.



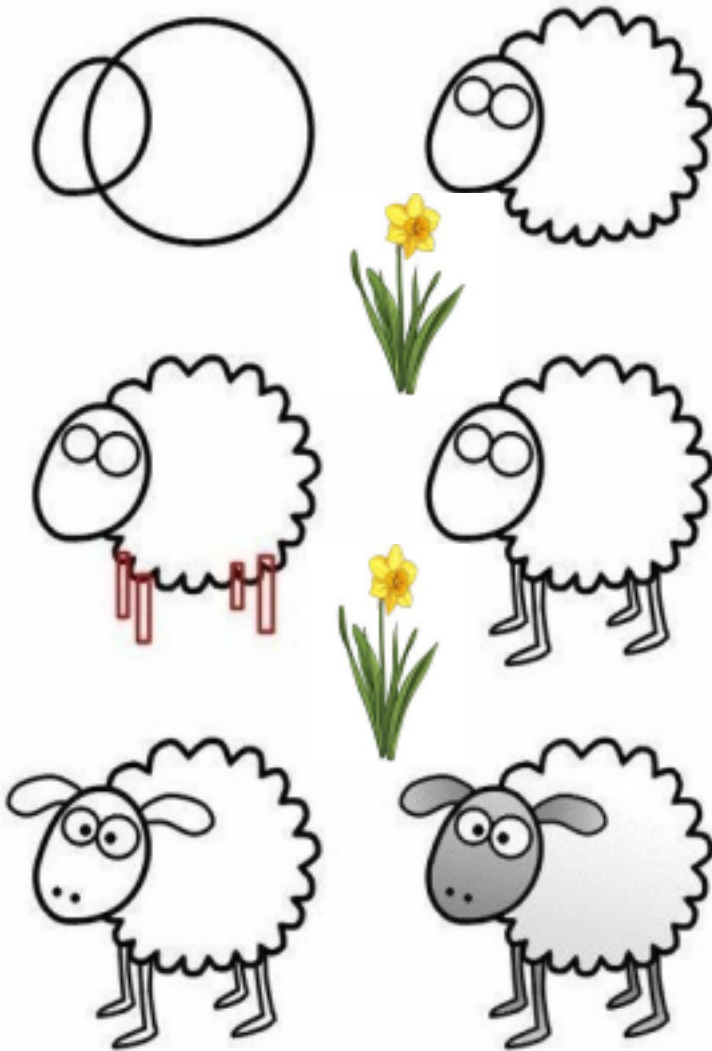
This helps them to see in different levels of light - in winter it's dark a lot, so the blue colour helps them make the most of the small amount of light, but in summer that would be dazzling and they wouldn't be able to see well, so the eyes turn yellow.

She said they'd be ready in about two weeks. On the way home mum lent him her mobile so he could ring Dan and tell him the good news.

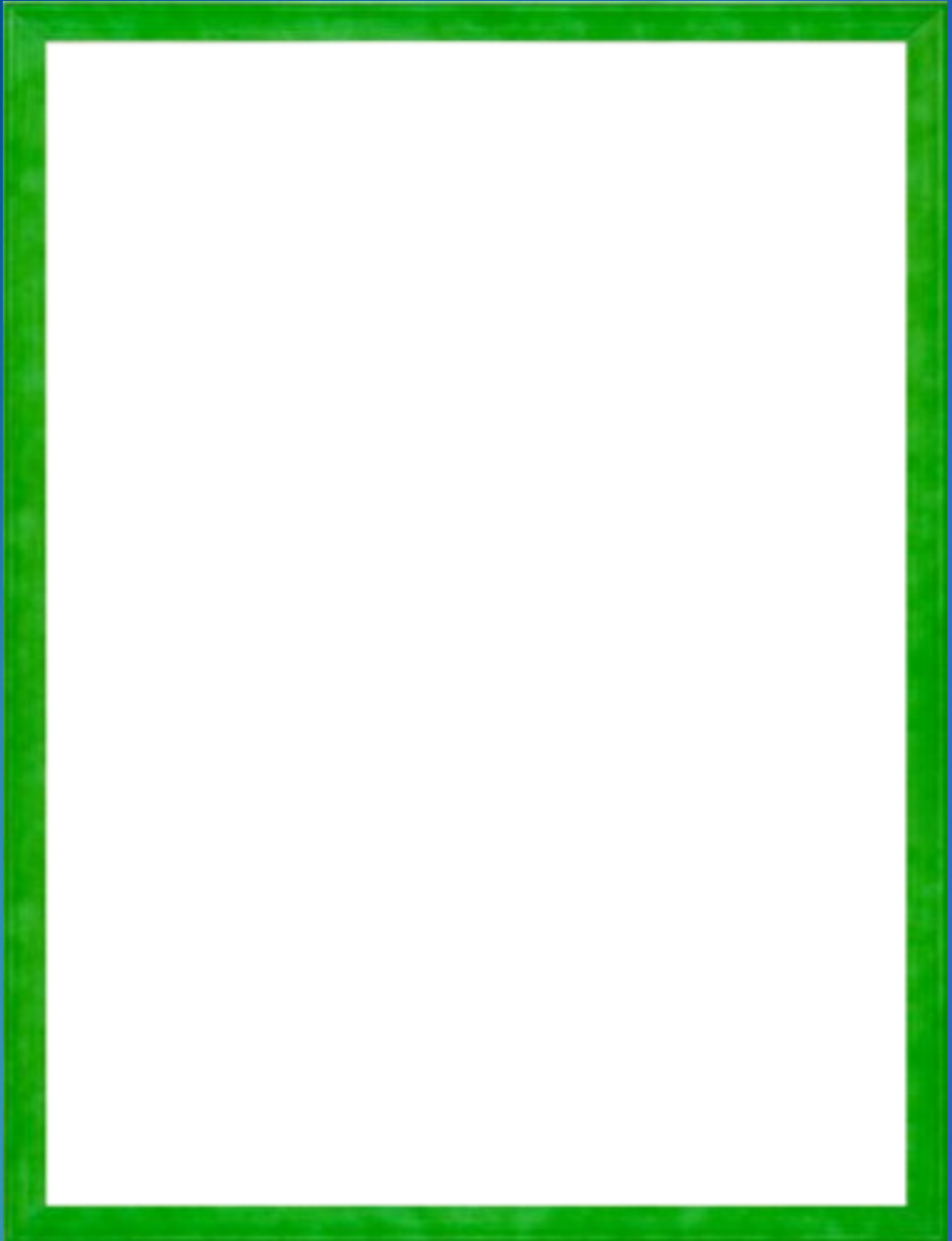


Once he got his glasses Zac realised what he'd been missing. It was much better; he could even see the little words and everyone said he looked just like his friend.
